



Suspensions Naming United States Federal Buildings

FLOOR SITUATION

The following bills are being considered on the floor under suspension of the rules and will require a two-thirds majority vote for passage.

These bills are expected to be considered on the floor on June 24, 2008.

SUMMARY

H.R. 2245 designates the facility of the Department of Veterans Affairs outpatient clinic in Wenatchee, Washington, as the "Elwood 'Bud' Link Department of Veterans Affairs Outpatient Clinic". This legislation was introduced by Representative Doc Hastings (R-WA) on May 9, 2007. The bill was referred to the House Committee on Veterans Affairs, but was never considered.

H.R. 4264 designates the facility of the Department of Veterans Affairs in Tampa, Florida as the "Michael Bilirakis Department of Veterans Affairs Spinal Cord Injury Center". This legislation was introduced by Representative Jeff Miller (R-FL) on December 4, 2007. The bill was referred to the House Committee on Veterans Affairs, but was never considered.

H.R. 4289 designates the facility of the Department of Veterans Affairs in Ponce, Puerto Rico, as the "Euripides Rubio Department of Veterans Affairs Outpatient Clinic". This legislation was introduced by Representative Luis Fortuno (R-PR) on December 5, 2007. The bill was referred to the House Committee on Veterans Affairs, but was never considered.

H.R. 4918 designates the facility of the Department of Veterans Affairs in Miami, Florida, as the "Bruce W. Carter Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center". This legislation was introduced by Representative Ileana Ros-Lehtinen (R-FL) on December 19, 2007. The bill was referred to the House Committee on Veterans Affairs, but was never considered.

H.R. 4010 designates the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 100 West Percy Street in Indianola, Mississippi, as the "Minnie Cox Post Office Building". This legislation was introduced by Representative Bennie Thompson (D-MS) on October 30, 2007. The bill was ordered to be reported by voice vote of the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform on June 12, 2008.
