



H.R. 3067 – Small Public Housing Authority Act

Floor Situation

H.R. 3067 is being considered on the floor under suspension of the rules and will require a two-thirds majority vote for passage. This legislation was introduced by Representative Randy Neugebauer (R-TX) on July 17, 2007. The bill was referred to the Committee on Financial Services but was not considered.

H.R. 3067 is scheduled to be considered on the floor on July 30, 2007.

Summary

H.R. 3067 exempts small public housing agencies from the requirement of preparing an annual public housing agency plan.

Background

The United States Housing Act of 1937 (PL 75-412) established the public housing program as part of the New Deal. Under this law, small public housing agencies are required to prepare an annual public housing agency plan. While a larger public housing agency has the resources to prepare this yearly report, some have concerns that smaller agencies struggle to produce this report and maintain services to the people they service.

Cost

The Congressional Budget Office has not scored this legislation.
