



Federal Building Naming Suspensions - October 15, 2007

FLOOR SITUATION

The following bills are being considered on the floor under suspension of the rules and will require a two-thirds majority vote for passage.

These bills are expected to be considered on the floor on October 15, 2007.

SUMMARY

H.R. 2089 designates the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 701 Loyola Avenue in New Orleans, Louisiana, as the "Louisiana Armed Services Veterans Post Office." This legislation was introduced by Representative William Jefferson (D-LA) on May 1, 2007 and was ordered to be reported by unanimous consent from the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform on September 20, 2007.

H.R. 3297 designates the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 950 West Trenton Avenue in Morrisville, Pennsylvania, as the "Nate DeTample Post Office Building." The legislation was introduced by Representative Patrick Murphy (D-PA) on August 1, 2007 and was ordered to be reported by unanimous consent from the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform on September 20, 2007.

H.R. 3572 which designates the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 4320 Blue Parkway in Kansas City, Missouri, as the "Wallace S. Hartsfield Post Office Building". This legislation was introduced by Representative Emanuel Cleaver on September 18, 2007 and was ordered to be reported by unanimous consent from the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform on October 4, 2007.

These bills have not been scored by the Congressional Budget Office (CBO).
