



H.R. 3891 – To amend the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Establishment Act to increase the number of Directors on the Board of Directors of the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation

FLOOR SITUATION

H.R. 3891 is being considered on the floor under suspension of the rules and will require a two-thirds majority vote for passage. This legislation was introduced by Representative Henry E. Brown, Jr. (R-SC) on October 18, 2007. The House Committee on Natural Resources ordered the bill to be reported by unanimous consent on March 12, 2008.

H.R. 3891 is expected to be considered on the floor of the House on March 31, 2008.

SUMMARY

H.R. 3891 amends the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Establishment Act (P.L. 103-232), to increase the number of members sitting on the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation's Board of Directors to thirty.

BACKGROUND

The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Establishment Act established the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation in 1984 as a nonprofit charitable corporation to conduct activities furthering the conservation management of U.S. fish, wildlife, and plant resources. Under current law, the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation's Board of Directors is to be composed of twenty-five members. It is currently chaired by Paul Tudor Jones, II from Connecticut.
