

Federal Ebola Response

Preventing and Battling Ebola on American Soil

- HHS currently has **\$58 million** in the pipeline for Ebola treatment
 - **\$15 million** for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to *track down Ebola patient contacts here and abroad, increase surveillance, and monitor disease progression*
 - **\$25 million** for the Biomedical Advanced Research and Development Authority (BARDA) to *develop and manufacture an Ebola vaccine*
 - **\$18 million** for National Institutes of Health to *speed up existing Ebola research*
- ✦ FY15 Continuing Resolution provided **an additional \$88 million**
 - ✦ **\$30 million** for CDC to increase its *efforts on the ground domestically and internationally*
 - ✦ **\$58 million** for BARDA to accelerate *Ebola vaccine and drug development*
- **Total CDC program level is above the Administration's FY15 request**

Rapid Response from the Department of Defense

- Reprogrammed **\$1.06 billion** in prior-year funding for *DoD efforts to combat the Ebola outbreak in Africa*
 - **\$1 billion** for *airlift, supplies, logistics, training, and an AFRICOM Joint Task Force to coordinate efforts*
 - **\$60 million** to monitor and track disease in support of *biosecurity concerns*
- Committee is working with Administration to *ensure U.S. military personnel are protected from exposure*
- Army to deploy **1,500** soldiers from 101st Airborne Division, as well as an additional **800** Army engineering personal and **490** Army general aviation personnel and equipment, in late October/Early November

Humanitarian Response from USAID

- Provided **\$64 million** in USAID funding
 - ⇒ **\$3 million** transferred to CDC
 - **\$30 million** for health services, logistics, burial teams, training, and relief commodities through *international organizations, NGOs, and USAID*
 - **\$7 million** for the World Food Program for *food aid for Liberia*
 - **\$9 million** for the World Health Organization for *Ebola response in target countries*
 - **\$10 million** for the African Union to *deploy doctors and nurses*
 - **\$5 million** for the Government of Liberia's *Ministry of Health staff salaries for 6 months*
- ✦ An additional **\$36 million** to be programmed within the next 3-5 weeks for *Ebola treatment units, care centers, community-based response efforts, burial teams, infection control in health facilities, preparedness training, and logistics*

Oversight of Federal Spending on Ebola Response

- Committee will maintain *close oversight over all federal dollars spent on Ebola response efforts*, including requesting a *full accounting of operational costs and monthly status reports* on the progress of the disease, efforts to combat outbreak and the security of American forces
